



REGULATIONS ARGENTINE ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE OLYMPIAD (OAIA)

Introduction

The Argentine Artificial Intelligence Olympiad (OAIA) is an educational and cultural initiative of national scope, held annually on a voluntary participation basis. Conceived and co-organized by the Inter-Institutional Center for Data Science (CID, UBA) and the Applied Artificial Intelligence Laboratory (LIAA, UBA-CONICET).

These two institutions form the OAIA Organizing Committee.

The Olympiad's core focus is the teaching, dissemination, literacy, and adaptation to secondary and higher education of knowledge in Artificial Intelligence for students across Argentina.

The content addressed in the OAIA constitutes an important instrument for fostering digital literacy and outreach in AI, with the aim of popularizing technological foundations, transparency, everyday applications, risks, and rights among the general population, and among secondary and higher education students in particular.

All decisions of the Olympiad, including any eventual amendments to these regulations, fall exclusively within the competence of the Organizing Committee.

The Olympiad's Testing Committee is composed of university professors, postgraduate students, and volunteer professionals working in the areas of AI, data science, and related fields.

The contents and assessments of the Olympiad are developed so that participants are exposed to a broad range of content related to Artificial Intelligence.

On the Olympiad's website, exercise booklets will be available so that each secondary education institution and/or individual student may practice and prepare for each year's rounds.

Context

In a global scenario of accelerated digital transformation, Artificial Intelligence has established itself as the defining technology of the 21st century. Knowledge and understanding of its foundations are imperative for citizenship, not only for productive innovation, but also for informed participation in society. The OAIA was created in response to this need, ensuring that Argentine students are equipped to be protagonists, and not merely consumers, of this technological revolution.

The OAIA is not conceived solely as a competition, but as a permanent platform to promote technological sovereignty and national scientific development in the field of Artificial

Intelligence. Our vision is to contribute to shaping the next generation of Argentine leaders and professionals capable of innovating and applying AI with a profound ethical and social sense. We seek to establish an educational standard aligned with the needs of Argentina's future.

Objectives

- Development of Analytical and Critical Skills: stimulating critical thinking, problem-solving, and analytical capacity through challenging questions and practical activities related to AI and allied sciences.
- Digital literacy: a powerful instrument for the development of accessible and didactic competencies in AI.
- Inclusion of the subject in basic education: promoting progressive and accessible learning in the field.
- Collaboration and knowledge exchange among students from different regions.
- Scientific outreach and popularization of AI among young audiences.
- Fair and inclusive competition through digital platforms.
- OAIA as a new beacon of talent in relation to AI and its studies.
- OAIA as a bridge between academia and secondary and higher education.

Ethical Commitment and Core Values

The Organizing Committee subscribes to a fundamental commitment to teaching AI from a rigorous, ethical, and responsible perspective. The Olympiad actively promotes algorithmic transparency, respect for diversity of thought, and the inclusion of participants from all socioeconomic and geographic backgrounds across the country. We firmly believe that excellence in AI must go hand in hand with social responsibility.

Target Audience and Categories

Any young person completing their secondary studies, university students, and graduates who meet the requirements may participate in the Argentine Artificial Intelligence Olympiad.

According to the categories defined in each year of organization, supporting documentation will be required.

Registration constitutes a sworn declaration; therefore, non-compliance will result in automatic disqualification and prohibition from participating in future editions of the Olympiad.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right of admission of any participant who fails to comply with the current regulations and their interpretation.

Registration

Registration must be completed directly on the Olympiad's website by filling in and submitting the required personal information.

By registering for the OAIA, the participant declares to have read, understood, and fully accepted these regulations.

The Organizing Committee commits to ensuring that each participant's registration data will not be shared with or used by third parties.

Awards

All participants will receive digital participation certificates (PDF).

The top-ranked participants from the qualifying round(s) will receive digital Certificates of Merit (gold, silver, and bronze).

The top participants from the elimination round(s) will receive digital medals according to their standing (gold, silver, and bronze) and the corresponding prize for the current year's OAIA edition.

Secondary education schools are encouraged to print the certificates and hold award ceremonies. Should new sponsorships arise, other forms of recognition may be announced.

General Provisions

By registering, participants accept all rules established in these regulations.

The Organizing Committee shall always have the final say regarding the interpretation of the regulations, unforeseen cases, and situations requiring immediate resolution.

The right to amend the regulations whenever deemed necessary is reserved.
